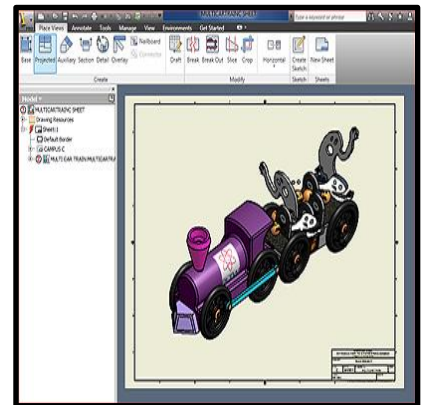
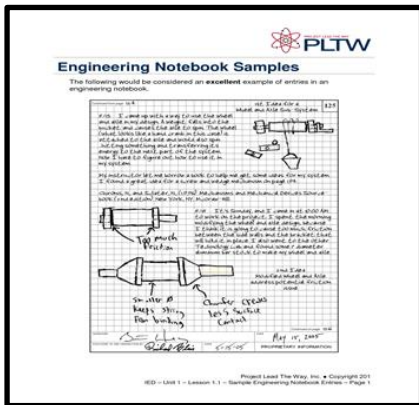


Introduction to Engineering Design
