Six Week Grading ---

Tests/Projects---40%

- Every three lessons has one test. You need to check the Google Classroom.
- Students can retake a failed test.

Language/communication---Listening/Speaking/Reading/writing--- 35%

- Dictations will be utilized.
- Students will create their own sentences by pictures interact with the teacher.

Daily/Quizzes/Homework ---25%

Retests---

A student who fails a test may retake a <u>similar</u> test under these conditions:

- A student must request a make-up test. He/She must schedule an appointment. This does not apply to the final exam.
- It must be understood that his/her highest grade on any retake test would be 70.
- All retakes must be completed <u>prior to</u> the end of each six week grading period.

2. Attendence Policy/Class Praticipation---

- You must enter/leave the classroom with your ID.
- You must be on time in class. You will be counted as absent if you are late for 20 minutes.
- Assistant Principal will talk to you if you are on the 5th tardy.

- You will be absent fail if you have the 5th day absent.
