Spanish II / PreAP Spanish II





Prerequisite: Successful completion of Spanish I

Course: 7310BB/7320BB Credits: 1 Length: 18 weeks Placement: 9-12

Course Description

This course further develops basic listening, speaking, reading and writing skills acquired in Spanish I while expanding vocabulary and grammatical application with an emphasis on oral and written expression. In addition, cultural aspects such as art, music, holidays and traditions are explored. Courses in cultural and linguistic topics introduce students to the study of Spanish speaking cultures. Students gain the knowledge to understand the historical development, geographical aspects, cultural aspects, and/or linguistic aspects of selected regions or countries. Art, music, dance, holidays, foods, history and traditions are explored.

A Project Based Learning approach is adapted for this class.

Some cross curricular elements are facilitated to create a unique cultural experience.

Student Activities

Listening: Students are exposed to various types of Spanish through conversations, music, and video. Speaking: Students are required to communicate in the target language independently and in dialogue. Writing: Students will practice verb conjugation, sentence structure and short essay.

Reading: Students will be assessed in reading through comprehension.
