Course Description

Pre-AP Japanese III prepares students to be ready to precede the AP level Japanese. The focus of the class will be all four methods of communication: speaking, listening, writing, and reading. The goal of the course is going beyond just survival in Japan: students farther expand their knowledge and skills of Japanese, understanding and utilizing authentic materials for communication, being able to discuss various topics by expressing both facts and their perspectives. More than 150 Kanji letters will be introduced.

Course Objectives

Students are expected to be able to:

- 1. Express own perspectives with reasons, using complex sentences (verbal & written).
- 2. Discuss various topics and appropriately respond in a given situation
- 3. Read authentic materials and understand their contents.
- 4. Comprehend authentic audio materials.
- 5. Enrich an understanding of Japanese culture and people in Japan.

Retaking Tests

If you wish to retake any tests except for the final exams, you will be given <u>ONE</u> opportunity to retake a test that you didn't perform well. You will receive your grade with the highest grade being a 70. It is **YOUR RESPONSIBILITY** to notify the teacher your intention to retake a test. You must retake the test before the six-week grading period. If you encounter the situation where you need to retake a test, it is **STRONGLY RECOMMENDED** you participate in tutoring.

Make-Up Tests/Assignments

If you are absent for the testing day for any reasons, it is **YOUR RESPONSIBILITY** to remind the teacher that you need to retake the test. You must take a test within TWO days from your last absence day.

Late Work

Students will lose 30 points or 30% when you turn in the assignment one A or B day for a late, meaning they will receive a zero for work turned in after one day late. Be on time!

There will be homework assignments. In addition to homework, students are expected to study for quizzes (Kanji & Vocabulary), and of course for tests.

Class Participation

Active participation is critical to master Japanese and expected from all students especially in Japanese III class. You will have a lot of opportunities to practice to speak though pair. Take advantage of the class time to learn and improve your Japanese language skills. This class is a stress free classroom: don't be afraid of making mistakes. The teacher will be speaking in the target language most times, meaning you must be paying attention to the class or you will miss critical information!

Pre-AP Japanese III

Please remember that the biggest goal for this class is literally for students to be ready for the AP Japanese IV. This class is ONLY for students who aim to PASS the AP Japanese Exam (NOT for experience, but for passing!) and who have strong determination to study hard to pass the exam. If you expect the level 3 class is similar to the level 1 & 2, you will soon realize that you MUST work much harder. Remember the grade for the Pre-AP Japanese III is determined exclusively based on the student's mastery of the Japanese language.

*Please understand the nature of AP courses. The AP Japanese Language and Culture course (AP Japanese IV) is "designed to be comparable to college/university Japanese courses that represent the point at which students complete approximately 300 hours of college-level classroom instruction." (quoted from AP Japanese Language and Culture Workshop Handbook, p3, Collegeboard)

Attendance and Tardy Policy

Please remember one class period at Ben Barber is equivalent to three class periods class at your home campus. If you miss one day, you miss three days! You cannot afford this. AP Japanese Language and Culture Exam

Due to the loss of state and federal funds, MISD will resume the practice of charging students a portion of the Advanced Placement exam cost. MISD is committed to ensuring AP exams are affordable for students, so will continue to pay a portion of each exam fee. We are sorry for any inconvenience this may cause.

AP exam: \$25 each

AP exam free-reduced program: \$12 each

Late testing exam: \$45 each Late-late testing exam: \$45 each

Unused exam: \$15 each

Students are automatically registered for the AP exam for any course for which they are enrolled. This registration process will now occur in the fall semester, and AP exam fees will be placed on each student's Skyward account at the beginning of the 2nd six weeks.

Students will have an <u>opportunity to opt-out</u> of the AP exam. Opt-out forms will be available from the Academic Associate after the 3rd week of school. The deadline to opt-out of an exam, with no fees, is Wednesday, October 15.

* Please remember you MUST pass the Pre-AP Japanese III to be in the AP Japanese IV. Registering for the AP Japanese Language and Culture Exam does NOT secure your being in the AP Japanese IV class.
